New Buckenham Parish Council

All parishioners are invited to the next Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 9th December 7:30 at the Village Hall. As always there will be an opportunity to raise any issues from around the village with Councillors.

In last month's meeting (see the Minutes, below) we agreed to apply to Norfolk County Council for an improved speed warning sign, and 'Playground' signage on the approach to the village from the Bunwell direction. The speed sign will replace the existing sign and will flash and advise drivers of their actual speed. Hopefully, this will encourage more drivers to reduce their speed down to the legal 20mph limit and raise awareness of the playground and of the presence of children in the vicinity of the playground. The new speed sign will have the added benefit of providing data on vehicle speeds which can be used to assist in our justifying other speed control methods in the village.

Our local district and county councillor gave an update on Local Government Reorganisation. Various options have now been put forward to create unitary authorities, which will result in the loss of the District Council tier of local government.

One issue that has been raised with the Parish Council is obstructions on the footpaths in the village, particularly plant and shrub pots. Some pots are positioned in rarely used sections of footpaths and do not cause a problem, others are more prominent and can result in pedestrians having to step into the road. It will be appreciated if owners of pots could be sensitive to blocking pedestrians and remove or reposition them.

The Parish Council wish all parishioners an enjoyable festive season and a happy New Year.

Summary of draft Minutes November 2025

Present: Andrew Bingham (AB), Paul Martin (PM), Karen Hobley (KH), Mary Dowson (MD), Mary Manning (MM), Don Crossman (DC), Steve Askew (SA) District/County Cllr, Angela Thornton (AT) Clerk and one member of the public.

1. Minutes

Minutes of the October meeting approved.

2. Matters arising

- a) NBPC will apply to the Parish Partnership by 1st December for funding for previously discussed Highway issues.
- b) The village map on the noticeboard is to be reprinted - ongoing.

3. Public Participation

A member of the Cricket Club apologised to residents for parking/traffic issues on the night of the Bonfire Event because of the high numbers attending and parking in and around the village. Discussion took place and NBPC suggested that bollards on key routes should be used to ensure access for emergency vehicles and suggested the organising committee review arrangements for future events.

4. District / County Councillor Report

Local Government Reorganisation - Districts have submitted their preferred models ranging from 1, 2 or 3 unitary options. Public consultations will take place with government ministers making a decision in spring 2026. Devolution - election of a Mayor in spring 2026 and a 'shadow authority' will operate until 2028, when the new approved structure will commence.

Local Plan - now out to public consultation, closing date 15th December.

5. Parish Councillor Reports

- a) KH reiterated the issue of dog fouling in the cemetery and closed churchyard. Signage is on order requesting dogs remain on leads.

b) AB reported back on a meeting attended hosted by Breckland District Council primarily regarding the Local Plan and Devolution.

6. Financial Matters

a) October Bank Reconciliation approved.

b) Payments for November 2025 approved.

c) Discussion of 2026/7 draft budget and precept took place. Option 3 agreed.

7. Planning

a) Inn on the Green appeal has been refused.

8. Amenities

a) Grounds Maintenance - draft tender discussed. The additional cost of the cuts to the cricket pitch will be added to Cricket Club invoice. Three tenders to be sought.

b) Closed Churchyard - request from PCC to repair the gate at the rear of the churchyard.

c) Cemetery - 'Dogs on Leads' sign to be purchased and displayed.

d) Allotments - annual bills sent out.

e) Play Area - annual inspection to be arranged.

f) Defibrillator - KH clarified that the defibrillator is only unavailable when it is physically removed.

g) Street Lights - AB reported tree growth around some lights need attention.

h) Community Car Scheme - nothing to report.

8. Correspondence.

East Anglian Air Ambulance Service has requested a donation. Donation of £100 agreed.
