New Buckenham's Common and its Grazing

Common Land is privately owned land subject to 'Rights of Common' that usually allow named individuals to graze animals. Enshrined in law in the Magna Carta in 1215, Common Land traditionally allowed the poorest people in rural communities to access wood, bracken for bedding and pasture for livestock.

Although nearly half of the land in Britain was originally Common Land, from the 16th century the gentry tried to enclose these areas to exclude commoners from land which could be 'improved' through agriculture. This gave rise, not least, to the local rebellion led by Robert Kett in 1549. Most Common Land is agriculturally 'unimproved', thus often having high conservation significance and natural beauty. Common Land now accounts for 3% of England.

New Buckenham Common is about 94 acres of land bisected by the B1113, also known as 'The Turnpike' or the 'Straight Road'. To the north of this road the Common is a biological SSSI, or Site of Special Scientific Interest, known particularly for its green-winged orchids. The Common is said to have remained largely unchanged for around 800 years, although was the subject of a dispute in 1597 when Carleton Rode claimed part of the Common next to Upgate Street. A copy of the map with accompanying narrative of this dispute is in the village hall.

Grazing the Common was formalised around 1770 by issuing Rights to graze amongst local households, either in whole Rights or in fractions of 14ths. Later, by now separated from named houses, whole Rights or fractions changed hands by a conveyance and unused Rights were historically auctioned in The George each Spring until the mid-1960s. Rights ownership have been officially registered from 1965. By the mid-1960s, however, the demand had fallen so the 79 Rights were pooled by those that owned them to hire the grazing to a single grazier for his cattle.

The Common had been traditionally owned by New Buckenham's successive lords of the manor. In 1985 this was Dr Hamerton, the

village's GP, who sold the Common to the then Norfolk Naturalists' Trust (now Norfolk Wildlife Trust). The price paid was £5, the money promptly being spent in the King's Head in celebration.

The Trust both owns and manages the Common to which it allows public access. At one time there was no fencing so cattle could wander freely across the road. With the danger from the increasing amount and speed of traffic however it was decided that there should be permanent fencing along the Straight Road to Norwich and temporary electric fencing during the grazing season, allowed by special license. As funds allow, the Trust is involved with the maintenance of gates and the cattle pound, now in poor repair, and the perennial battle to stop scrub invading the grazable areas. Scrub is attractive to wildlife but excessive amounts reduce the walking amenity enjoyed by the village and visitors. It also risks making the grazing unviable. This matters because cattle play an essential part in 'depasturing the land' and propagating orchid seeds so if they were to be withdrawn due to insufficient grazing, the habitat would change irrevocably. In the last few years the Common has been under stress from increasing scrub, degradation of the grazing by rabbits, and from drought.

Recently the grazing Right holders have been taking a more active interest in enhancing the relationship between the Trust, the grazier and the villagers and visitors who greatly value this natural amenity on our doorstep.

The grazier pays for the grazing of his cattle, the modest income being distributed among the Right holders based on the number of Rights they hold. Existing Right holders may choose to dispose of their Rights, either by formal selling or by transfer. The steering group will try to ensure that any Rights that do become available are transferred to village residents. Please let us know if you are interested so we can put you in touch with sellers as and when the opportunity arises.

It is shocking to realise that 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime, and 750,000 child incidents of domestic abuse are reported in the UK every year. Given those statistics, we do hope you will come along and support us in raising funds for this, sadly, much needed service.

End of the line for two non-villager villagers...

Two characters of significance to New Buckenham, have died in this last month. Neither of them were villagers, but both loved the place dearly, came here constantly and made a contribution.



One was a Royal Navy PO chef who visited for all of the 40 or so years that Ross and I have lived here – that is when he wasn't sailing around the world on aircraft carriers and other fleet ships and cooking for thousands at a time. His name was Simon Trewin. He was my brother. Diagnosed with Parkinson's ten years ago, he ploughed on, undaunted alongside his wife, WO1 Paula Trewin MBE, becoming a home based dad-of-distinction for their daughter, Dorcas. It was Simon who made and donated the bat boxes for the children's wildlife area here in the village.

The other non-villager who has left us all too soon, was Terry Jones. He and his family have been coming all the way from Belfast every year, twice a year for 40 years. He loved the place. He was even on the Parish Mag list so he could keep up with the local news. They came to relax in the countryside and to avoid the stress of the "Marching Season" during the "Troubles", and then coming back in November to enjoy bonfire night since fireworks were banned in the Province. Terry was a knowledgeable birder, a lover of nature, the head of a school English department in NI and the most educated reader you could come across.



His New Buckenham Nature Notes documented invaluable wildlife observations in these changing days: turtle doves, great crested newts, grass snakes, English Partridges, hares, hedgehogs, deer, crickets, bats...and yes! he was fixated with cricket and bats and encouraged our son to play the game! Every year there was a crusade to Redgrave



and Lopham Fen in a bid to find the, now officially endangered, great raft spider.

Both of these men have left some of their spirit in this unique village...and when I say “spirit” that includes a tot of pussers’ rum for Si and an English whisky for Terry, made just down the road and which won the taste-test over all the traditional Irish and Scottish brands. We raise a glass to them both.

In the few weeks since our just giving site opened, we have raised more than £4,000 for Parkinson’s UK. It’s never enough, but we keep on trying and maybe one day this debilitating condition will be ended. www.justgiving.com/page/simon-trewin.

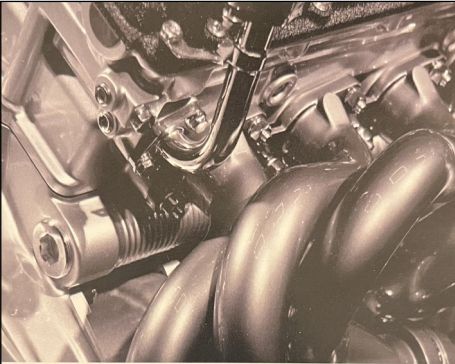
